



1 MIZKAN MUSEUM

An interactive museum where you can touch, enjoy, and learn about the history of vinegar production at Mizkan and the appeal of Japanese cuisine. A museum tour provides visitors with information about how vinegar is made and its characteristics. There is also a gift shop that sells original merchandise.

2 Important Cultural Property Bishu Utsumi Cargo Vessel Owner Uchida Residence (Uchida Sashichi Residence)

The residence of Uchida Sashichi, who was an influential ship owner and leader of Utsumi from the end of the Shogunate era into the Meiji era. It is one of the largest extant ship owner's residences on the Pacific Ocean side of Japan. (Museum of History and Folklore)

6 Morita Aji-no-Yakata

Traditional food culture is exhibited in this brewery storehouse from the Edo period. Visitors can also shop for sake, miso, and soy sauce, and even enjoy a meal there. There is also a museum commemorating Akio Morita, the founder of SONY, next door.

3 Nakasada Shoten, Brewery Museum (Denshokan)

Established in 1879, this brewery produced mame-miso and tamari soy sauce with Japan-grown soy beans in massive 2.4-meter cedar barrels. There is also a museum displaying brewery tools and historical resources, and a shop in a converted storehouse.

9 Nippon Steel, Nagoya Works

A rare opportunity to see inside a blast furnace and experience up close the sight of red-hot iron ingots being stretched thin. You will be amazed by the scale of the steelworks. Enjoy a tour inside the only general steel base in the Chubu region.

12 Flight of Dreams

Shopping complex revolving around an exhibit of the first Boeing 787, to commemorate the fact that 35% of the fuselage of that aircraft is manufactured in the Chubu region. Visitors can enjoy nine hands-on experiences, including a show that simulates the sights and sounds of flight, original merchandise, and Seattle cuisine.

19 Minamichita Onsen-Go Hot Spring Town

The hot springs in the three districts of Utsumi, Yamami, and Toyohama are collectively referred to as Minamichita Onsen Village. The hot springs are strong briny sodium chloride springs that are said to be good for chronic dermatitis, cuts, fatigue, burns, poor circulation, and gynecological disorders. 14 JA Aguri Town Genki-no-Sato

Shopping complex revolving around a large farmer's market selling food grown on the Chita Peninsula. Facilities that have "food and agriculture" and "health" as their themes include a kitchen for making bread and side dishes, a horticultural center selling flowers and greenery, a natural hot spring, restaurants, and the sweets and food court, "Sukusukugaoka."

15 Unohana-kan (Higashiura Local Museum, Archaeological Center)

Facility for the presentation of the town's historical and cultural heritage, including archeological items such as kaizuka shell mounds and ancient kilns, ancient documents, and folk tools, and for the study and research of archeological properties and historical resources. The facility also holds special exhibitions and classes.

16 Handa Red Brick Building (Old Kabuto Beer Brewery plant)

The Handa Red Brick Building's first incarnation was in 1898 as the brewery for Kabuto Beer. It was one of the five largest brick buildings erected during the Meiji period (1868-1912). You can enjoy the restored Kabuto Beer from the Meiji and Taisho periods.

17 Ajinomoto Taketoyo (miso & tamari)

A machi-no-eki, or town rest area, with a section selling world-famous Japanese miso and tamari, as well as local products such as fruit, vegetables, rice, and traditional sweets. There is also a food court.

20 Himakajima and Shinojima Islands

Accessible by about a 10-minute ride on the high-speed ferry from Morozaki Port. Himakajima is packed with photogenic spots, such as the Lovers' Swing and motifs of octopus and pufferfish. Renting a bicycle to ride around the island is a popular activity. Shinojima has a history of deep connections with Ise Shrine and features many historical sites. The fishing is good all year round, and you can fish off a boat or in a fishing pond.

21 Old Taketoyominato Station Turntable

Taketoyo's turntable is a right-angled dual-track turntable. As the only one of its kind still existing in Japan, it is a precious piece of railway heritage. (Important Tangible Cultural Property of Japan)

22 Handa Canal

Handa has long had a flourishing brewing industry, with vinegar, sake, and other brewed products being transported down the Handa Canal, one of Japan's three largest canals, by cargo vessels on their way to Edo and other destinations. The scenery of Handa Canal and the brewery storehouses still evokes the image of those days, when they sent out into the world the "Vinegar of Bishu Handa," a highly prized commodity in Edo.

Minamichita, which has the ocean on three sides, has five swimming beaches - Utsumi, Yamami, Shinojima, Himakajima West, and Himakajima East. They can all be enjoyed summer festivals. In particular, Utsumi Beach has a magnificent fireworks festival. Mihama has swimming beaches at Okuda, Wakamatsu, Noma, and Onoura on the Ise Bay side. Each of these swimming beaches has a Kalyusa, at which visitors can enjoy beach sports and other fun beach activities.

38 Toyohama Tai Festival (Toyohama Tai Matsuri)
Giant sea breams, ranging in length from 10 to 18 meters, are carried on the shoulders of "men of the sea" (young men) on the beach and throughout the town. It is held on a weekend around July 20 every year.

39 Omanto Festival
At the autumn festival praying for a good harvest held by the shrines of each district of the town, a horse chase called Omanto is held. The town's young people, wearing bells on their backs, grab hold of the horses running around a fenced-in paddock and run alongside them.

40 Kamezaki Shiohi Festival
A majestic festival in which five giant floats are dragged down to the beach in front of Kamisaki Shrine at low tide. All five floats are topped by mechanical dolls, whose resplendent dancing is not to be missed. This festival has a history stretching back more than 300 years and was inscribed in the UNESCO List of Intangible Cultural Properties in 2016. It is held on May 3 and 4 every year.

41 Doburoku Festival (Nagakusaten Shrine)
A traditional event that has continued for more than 500 years since the Muromachi Period. Free doburoku, a kind of cloudy sake, is handed out, mochi rice cakes are thrown out to the crowd, and, in an event called Shojo-metta, red-faced mythical creatures called Shojo run around the shrine grounds.

42 Odai Festival
This is the birthplace of Odai-no-Kata, the mother of the powerful shogun, Tokugawa Ieyasu (1543-1616). In mid-April, when the double-flowered cherry trees are in full bloom along Odai-no-Michi, a promenade alongside Myotokuji River, the Odai Parade and other events are held as part of the festival.

43 Chrysanthemum Exhibition
An exhibit of the large chrysanthemum blossoms grown by the residents at Fureai no Mori. In the 1987 edition of the "Japan's No. 1 Cities and Towns for Anything and Everything" guidebook published by the National Land Agency, this exhibition was recognized as the best resident-participation chrysanthemum show in Japan.

Fugu (Pufferfish)
The king of Minamichita and Mihama's abundant seafood varieties in winter (Oct. - Mar.). The whole fish can be enjoyed without a single morsel left uneaten, as sashimi, in shabu-shabu hotpot, as karaage (deep-fried), in zosui (rice gruel), hirezake (hot sake with grilled fish fins), and grilled shirako (soft roe). Many hotels and inns offer accommodation plans combined with a course of fugu cuisine.

Chita Beef
Chita Beef, raised in the abundance of nature around Handa, the birthplace of Chita dairy, is known for its tender meat and sweet fat. It is held in high regard as a brand beef.

44 Toyohama Sakana Hiroba Fishplaza (seafood, octopus, whitebait)

Toyohama Fishing Port boasts the largest seafood catch in Aichi Prefecture. The fish market here is attractive for its wide range of seafood varieties available, the freshness, and the direct-from-the-boat prices. Experience the high energy of a wholesale market and enjoy a meal of seafood caught that very day at the popular cafeteria.

It is the symbol of Tokoname, one of Japan's largest production regions of manekineko "beckoning cat" figurines. With its left paw raised, Tokonayan watches over the town, beckoning in a flood of visitors and customers.

A journey in Chita Shikoku

The Chita Peninsula is one of Japan's greatest "New Shikoku" holy pilgrimage routes



Long, long ago, Kobo Daishi landed on Chita Peninsula on his way to a pilgrimage in the Eastern provinces. Kobo Daishi is said to have been surprised by how the beautiful scenery of the peninsula closely resembled Shikoku. The full pilgrimage in the footsteps of Kobo Daishi is 194 km long. This region has been the subject of poems since ancient times. In 1809, Ryozan Ajari, the priest of Myorakuji Temple (No. 79), was visited in a dream by Kobo Daishi and ordered to pray. He performed repeated pilgrimages to Shikoku and, with the help of the ascetics, Okado Hanzo and Takeda Yasubei, established the Chita Shikoku Pilgrimage. Since then, people have come from all over Japan in a quest for Kobo Daishi's wondrous virtues. There have also been countless tales of miracles. The Chita Shikoku Pilgrimage consists of 88 official temples, three kaizansho, which are temples dedicated to Okado Hanzo and Takeda Yasubei, and seven amulet-issuing temples, for a total of 98 temples.

51 Nomadaibou

(Final resting place of Minamoto no Yoritomo)
A temple built at the order of Emperor Shirakawa (1052-1129). Inside the vast temple grounds there is the Hondo, or Main Hall, the Kyakuden, or Visitor's Hall, which is a Cultural Property of Aichi Prefecture, and a temple bell designated as an Important Cultural Property of Japan. The grave of the shogun, Minamoto no Yoritomo (1147-1199), is also located here.






